Getting garden ready and water wise

RUSTENBURG HERALD- RUSTENBURG- On 16 August a workshop with 18 teachers was held at the Tlholego Ecovillage and Learning Centre with funding from Bakwena Toll Concession.

The programme involved sharing the environmental projects that schools had accomplished during the first half of the year and discussing gaps that still needed to be filled for the school to qualify for their Eco-School awards in 2017.

During the second half of the programme teachers toured the facility to observe and question water saving techniques first-hand such as rainwater harvesting, drip irrigation, use of mulch, worm farming and compost making, grey water treatment and re-use and functioning waterless composting toilets.

The parabolic solar cooker and hay box cookers started discussion around saving energy and rising electricity costs. The diversity of plants especially beneficial herbs and weeds interested many as ways to boost nutritional content of food and health were discussed.

Ms Mmabatho Mangope, one of the attending teachers had the following to say after the workshop, "now we understand and we are ready to follow the seven steps of Eco-schools and a sustainable path."
